Dear friends of the Sunny Fund

Wishing you all a Happy New Year

We're hoping that 2010 will be a momentous year for the Sunny Fund, we have lots of plans and hopes for the year ahead.



For us as a family 2010 feels particularly poignant as Sunny would have turned 30 in July 2010, and it will also be six years since his death. Whilst this makes us feel very sad to be without Sunny, we hope that in a small way the work of the Sunny Fund can have a positive impact on young people's lives and help them to fulfil their potential.

Over the past five years the Sunny Fund has supported many young people and continues to do so. However, to mark the year that Sunny would have turned 30 we would like to try and help even more. To mark this occasion we are launching a special campaign: 30 for 30. Our aim is simple - to fund 30 new projects throughout the year and to ask as many of our supporters to help us achieve this by donating £30 to the fund. If you don't feel able to give £30 perhaps you could ask three friends to give £10, or 10 friends to give £3, or 30 friends to give £1.

The donations the Sunny Fund has received over the last five years have made it possible for the Fund to make a really positive impact on young people's lives. From small things like funding bursaries for swimming lessons, tennis coaching, football training music classes, dog handling, maths tuition and kit for dance classes through to bigger projects like supporting cheerleading for up to 40 children, a school gardening club, funding a year's attendance at an after school club and a Primary school lunch time club.

Most of these initiatives involved small amounts of money to support the young people' but achieved real impact through opening up new experiences and opportunities for the youngsters, which they would have been otherwise denied. So as part of our 30 for 30 campaign we want to help even more young people have new experiences and opportunities. We already have a number of fundraising ideas in place such

- Sunny Fund badges
- Pop-up market stalls across London
- Gary and Kai plan to run a Half-marathon in October

- Fundraising teas in Ireland and London
- Asking Waitrose in Islington and Holloway to include the Sunny Fund as one of their in store charities
